

Gulf CHMA Update – Apr 2013, Cycle 29

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As of the 29th cycle, the total number of MB surveyed has increased from 5202 to 5225 with 526 of these having n/a (i.e. not available – 10% total not surveyed). In the 5 County area, the number of multi-blocks surveyed increased from 813 to 820 and 78 MB had n/a for their data (10% not surveyed). For comparison, total MBs surveyed in the other CHMAs combined totaled 4,405MB with 448 n/a for 10% not surveyed. The 29th cycle of the statewide survey was completed on 29 March 2013. All Counties but Collier increased substantially in ACP densities. The map now shows only Cycles 22 – 29 to better fit the data (Fig. 1). The number of hotspots has increased from 2 to 3 (i.e. Multi-block ID with ≥ 21 psyllids) for Cycles 27, 28, and 29 (see interactive map on our website for locations of psyllid counts and hotspots).
