

# Gulf CHMA Update – Aug 2012, Cycle 18

As of the 18<sup>th</sup> cycle, the total number of MB surveyed has increased from 4,845 to 5,010 with 724 of these having n/a (i.e. not available – 14% not surveyed). In the 5 county area, the number of multi-blocks surveyed increased from 799 to 821, and 95 MB had n/a for their data (88% surveyed). The 17<sup>th</sup> cycle of the statewide survey was completed on 10 August 2012. Charlotte and Hendry county ACP counts are stabilizing. Lee County psyllid numbers are declining. Glades County ACP counts are now similar to the other counties. Collier County is having a steady increase. The map now shows only Cycles 8 – 18 to better fit the data (Fig. 1). There are now 22 hotspots (i.e. Multi-block ID with  $\geq 21$  psyllids) for Cycles 16, 17, and 18 (see interactive map for locations).
