

Gulf CHMA Update – July 2012, Cycle 16

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As of the 16th cycle, the total number of MB surveyed has stabilized at 5,073 with 1,317 of these having n/a (i.e. not available – 26% not surveyed). In the 5 county area, the number of multi-blocks surveyed decreased from 868 to 794, and 242 MB had n/a for their data (70% surveyed). The 16th cycle of the statewide survey was completed on 29 June 2012. All counties are on the increase in ACP counts with a substantial escalation of ACP in Lee County. The map now shows only Cycles 8 – 16 to better fit the data (Fig. 1). Glades County is skyrocketing upwards, while the others are in a steady incline. There are now 9 hotspots (i.e. Multi-block ID with \geq 21 psyllids) for Cycles 13, 14, and 15 (see interactive map for locations).
