

Gulf CHMA Update – September 2013, Cycle 36

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As of the **36th cycle**, the total number of MB surveyed decreased from 5467 to 5455 but with 373 of these having n/a (i.e. not available – 7% total not surveyed). In the 5 County area, the number of multi-blocks surveyed decreased from 807 to 794 but with 100 MB had n/a for their data (13% not surveyed). For comparison, total MBs surveyed in the other CHMAs combined totaled 4,661 MB with 616 n/a for 13% not surveyed. The 36th cycle of the statewide survey was completed on 5 August 2013. Charlotte, Collier, Glades and Lee Counties had ACP decreases. Hendry County had ACP counts stabilizing. The map now shows only Cycles 30 – 36 to better fit the data (Fig. 1). The number of **hotspots** still remains on **0** (i.e. Multi-block ID with ≥ 21 psyllids) for Cycles 34, 35, and 36 (see interactive map on our website for locations of psyllid counts and hotspots).

Figure 1 - Average ACP per Gulf CHMA Cycle by County

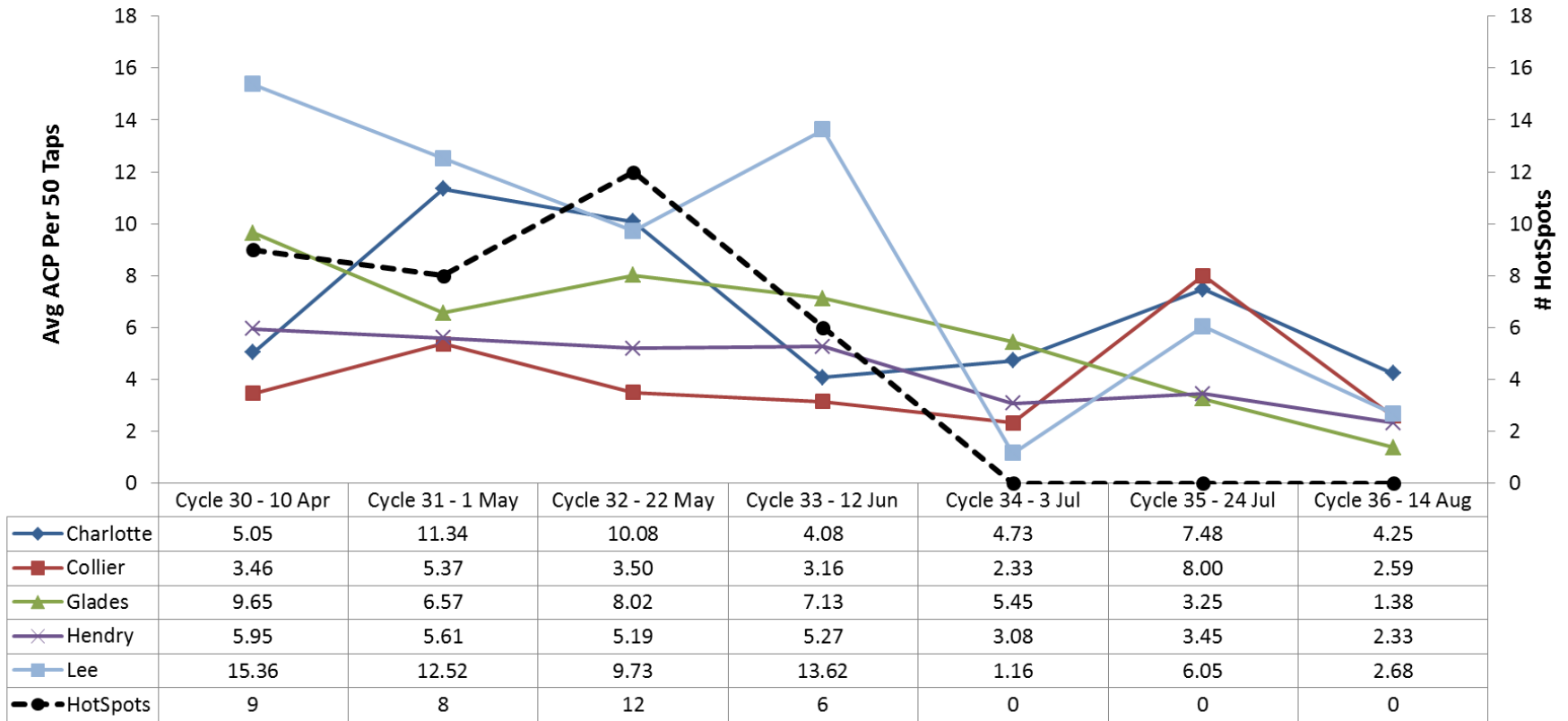


Figure 2 – Evolution of HotSpots in The Gulf CHMA
