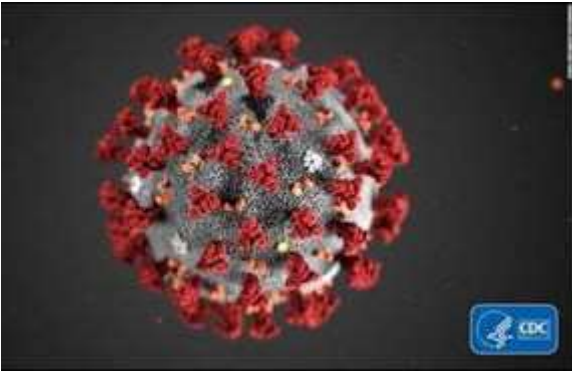

SWFREC COVID-19 Update

The UF Research Resumption Plan is nearing its completion. With that, SWFREC is busily resuming data collection, which was put on hold in March at the onset of the Corona virus, both at the center and on cooperative grower properties. As projects proposed by SWFREC faculty continue to be approved by UF/IFAS administration, research in greenhouses,

screenhouses, and laboratories is in full swing and vegetable fields are being prepared for new plantings (see photos below).

Some SWFREC faculty and staff continue to work remotely, but several have returned to work at the center on a staggered-schedule basis. We have in place a center-wide safety plan that includes hand sanitizing stations and the requirement to wear masks. In continuing to strive to be prudent and provide the best service possible while keeping our clientele and our staff safe during the COVID-19 pandemic, grower clientele should continue to contact faculty and staff via e-mail addresses provided on our web site: <https://swfrec.ifas.ufl.edu/>.

While grower meetings have been offered solely virtually for nearly four months, we are beginning to plan in-person meetings, using proper social distancing protocol, in the coming weeks.
