SWFREC Research Puts the Power of AI into the Hands of Florida Growers

In a research project led by a SWFREC artificial intelligence (AI) scientist, [Dr. Nikos Tziolas](#) envisions a way to put the power of AI into the hands of Florida growers. The new project, which stems from a \$297,000 grant from the USDA's National Institute of Food and Agriculture, is developing an interactive tool for farmers to assess crop damage after major storms. The conversational AI system utilizes a platform similar to ChatGPT to unlock the value of satellite imagery by making it easily accessible and understandable to non-expert users, such as growers and Extension agents via a simple chat-based interface.

Senior UF/IFAS public relations specialist Brad Buck wrote a press release, "UF Scientists to Develop AI Technology to Help Growers Assess Crop Damage after Hurricanes," about Dr. Tziolas' exciting work. Not surprisingly, the article garnered a lot of media attention. ([See more](#))
